Introduction from the Chief Executive

This is a short summary of the Council's budget for 2020. It sets out the main sources of income and the various services that the budget will be used to deliver.

Budget 2020 provides for expenditure of €138,092,906 an increase of

over €15m (or 12.2%) on last year's budget. This is a very positive position and has been possible through a continued focus on maximising the use of resources at our disposal, strong budgetary management processes, increased income in a number of service areas and greater effort in securing higher levels of grant funding.


It will also bring enhanced service levels and provide additional human and financial resources in critical and emerging areas.

Budget Preparation

Budget 2020 was prepared in the statutory format and in consultation with the Corporate Policy Group for consideration by the Elected Members.



The preparation of Budget 2020 was complicated by the Re-Valuation Process that was undertaken by the Valuation Office. This is part of a national programme, involving the revaluing of all rateable properties in Meath during 2019.

The main sources of income available to fund Budget 2020 are set out here:




Budget Expenditure


In 2018, the Council spent ξ 599.40 per person in the county, (up from ξ 534.19 per person in 2017). This is well below the national average expenditure per capita for 2018, which was ξ 978.91 per person.

It is worth underlining that Meath County Council embodies the 'doing more with less' approach. The Council continues to have the lowest revenue expenditure per capita of any local authority in the State.

That said, the budget will help deliver essential services to communities across the county, address key challenges and make a significant impact on the local economy and in securing local jobs.






